25th, the Alliance is sponsoring a Soil Health and Cover Crop Field Day - "Unlock the Secrets of the Soil" - at Kellogg Farms in Slippery Rock, PA on July 30th. Thanks to the dedication and commitment of Directors Bill Cannon and Ryan Graham and the cooperation of Andy Gaver of US-DA-NRCS we are pleased to once again expand our "reach" into a different part of the state.

Innovative Indiana Farmer Rick Clark to be Field Day Keynote Speaker

Rick Clark, a 5th generation farmer from Williamsport, Indiana manages 7,000 acres of crop land, growing primarily corn, soybeans, wheat and alfalfa. A main component of his no-till system is maximizing cover crop performance and planting his cash crops into living covers to build biomass, suppress weeds, recycle nutrients and feed soil microbes.


His presentation "Getting the Most from Your No-Till Operation by Farming Green" will share details of techniques and adjustments he's made to successfully no-till crops into green covers.

Also addressed will be his experience with utilizing diverse cover species and rotations to maximize his production and

his decision to grow non-GMO corn and soybeans for specific markets. He is also in the process of transitioning a portion of his acreage into organic production.

When addressing the 2019 National No-Till Conference, Rick observed that he "challenges everyone to get a little uncomfortable...I think you'll like the way it feels."

A Variety of "Hands On" Things to See at Summer Field Days

By its very nature a "field day" should feature more than speakers and power point presentations and that is certainly the case with several this summer.

For starters the Alliance Field Day at Hershey Farm on July 25th will feature:

- A unique "checkerboard" cover crop plot where 7 foot strips of various seed mixes have been planted in a criss-cross pattern to showcase 64 different multi-species combinations
- Farmer-owned planters set up by their owners to handle different plant-ing situations

- Inter-seeded 30 and 60-inch row corn with multiple cover crop mixes and different herbicide treatments
- Dawn Equipment's new "RowMow" weed management system

On July 30th, the "Unlock the Secrets in the Soil" Field Day will take an indepth look at:

- Various cover crop seed mixes and their benefits
- Increasing Walter infiltration and nutrient recycling with cover crops

At the "Farming for the Future" Field Day on August 27^{th,} sponsored with USDA-NRCS at the Jeff Pontius farm, there will be breakout sessions covering:

- · Calibrating a no-till drill
- Agronomy trials at Don Cotner Farms
- Demonstration on precision ag with a lime truck
- Field mapping and precision application

All of these provide valuable "learn by seeing" opportunities for those interested in taking their no-till and cover crop practices to a new level.
