BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING MINUTES May 23, 2022 7:00 PM

Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance – B. Bruckhart opened the meeting at 7 p.m. and led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Board shared their appreciation for Travis Rohrer's 9 ½ years of service to the Township as a member of the Northern Lancaster County Regional Police Commission. He has submitted his resignation to the Commission.

New Business

- A motion was made by G. Stevens, with a second by R. Krause, to adopt Ordinance 2022-03, Add an On-Street Handicapped Parking Space on S. Main Street. The motion passed unanimously.
- M. Hiester noted the Ordinance was duly advertised. Gerald Wolfe questioned if the sign is not needed after the resident that needs the parking spot leaves, will the sign be taken down? M. Hiester responded that yes, it may be removed by a new Ordinance. B. Bruckhart noted there are now 2 property owners in the area that need handicapped parking spaces.
- A motion was made by R. Landis, with a second by T. Walsh, to adopt Resolution 2022-15, \$240,000 1-year Certificate of Deposit from Agricultural Preserve Fund. The motion passed unanimously.
- A motion was made by T. Walsh, with a second by G. Stevens, to adopt Resolution 2022-16 Authorizing Supplemental Expenditures of ARP Funds in the 2022 Fiscal Budget. The motion passed unanimously.
- G. Stevens questioned by what date the funds have to be used. M. Hiester responded that they must be contracted to be spent by December 31, 2024.
- A motion was made by R. Landis, with a second by R. Krause, to approve the Traffic Signals Preventive Maintenance \$2,025 Agreement with C.M. High, Inc. The motion passed unanimously.
- The MS4 Pollution Reduction Plan Comment Period in still available for residents to make comments.
- A motion was made by R. Landis, with a second by R. Krause, to authorize the Township Solicitor to advertise the Zoning Code Amendment. The motion passed unanimously.

• A motion was made by G. Stevens, with a second by T. Walsh, to authorize Township Staff to send a letter acknowledging the Lancaster Bicycle Club Covered Bridge Classic Bicycle Ride through Penn Township. The motion passed unanimously.
