BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING MINUTES August 25, 2025 7:00 PM

Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance – Ben Bruckhart opened the meeting at 7 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comment & Guest Recognition – Latrobe Barnitz gave an update on the new Manheim Community Library, noting the following:

- There is an increase in the number of visitors, library cards, and books being borrowed.
- They were able to hire a new staff member, and are looking to increase it to one more, in late 2025.
- There is a need for more shelving and books to accommodate the new patrons.
- The library and historical society are combining for a PA250 series of events to celebrate the United States' 250th anniversary in 2026.
- Listed numerous events that are regularly held: Toddler Time, Family Story Time, Computer Help, Unraveling Yarns, Book Club, Crafternoon, Read to a Therapy Pet, and more.
- There are discussions in place with Pleasant View to utilize a shuttle for residents to get from town to the library.

Subdivision, Land Development & Stormwater Management Plans

- 24-008: Land Development Plan for 149 Doe Run Road, Grant of Time Extension to Penn Township until September 9, 2025, Recommendation of Approval motioned by Landis, seconded Stevens, approved 5-0.
- Small Project Stormwater Management Plan for 370 Doe Run Road, Recommendation of Conditional Approval motioned by Walsh, seconded by Landis, approved 5-0.

New Business

- Year 2026 Budget Calendar motioned by Landis, seconded by Eisenhauer, approved 5-0.
- East Petersburg Borough Fire Police Request for assistance on Saturday, September 20, 2025, for a 5k run was motioned by Walsh, seconded by Stevens, approved 5-0.
- Repair Salt Shed Solar Return on Investment was tabled until more information is given.
- County Planning Memorandum of Understanding to Expedite Certain Land Development Plans was motioned by Landis, seconded by Eisenhauer, approved 5-0.
- Approve Driveway Waiver Requests for 736 Park Hill Drive recommendation to approve the driveway was given by Public Works Director, Shannon Martin. Landis opposed a second driveway. Bruckhart considered it as one, after it is all complete. Motioned by Stevens, seconded by Walsh, approved 4-1. Landis voting no.

Consent Agenda

- August 11, 2025 Meeting Minutes were motioned by Eisenhauer, seconded by Landis, approved 5-0.
- Treasurer's Reports and Approval to Pay Invoices: Walsh voiced concern regarding having used 77% of our budget for account number 409.361 PP&L (electric) at \$1,023 for the year, but we are only in August. After a brief discussion with the board, a motion was made by Walsh, seconded by Eisenhauer, approved 5-0. Staff to identify why we spend more on phone and data at the office than on electricity.

 - Will be fully staffed once the cadets graduate from the police academy
